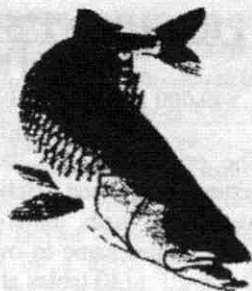

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

\$40,000 in Picnic Tables, You must be Fooling???

The price of things these days is really getting out of hand. Believe it or not, when we did the math, the cost of replacing our picnic tables came to over Forty Thousand Dollars!!! (140 tables at \$290 each). So it was not a difficult decision to take a close look at how we could preserve our existing tables and have them in shape for our annual picnic, and to also have them more attractive for picnic ground rentals.

This process actually started prior to last years picnic with **Ron Potter** power washing a large number of the tables, and then with **Ron & Dianne Rodrigues** and **Rich & Kathy Stephenson** moving the tables so that the picnic area can be built up for proper drainage and their initial marking of those boards that need to be replaced on each table. **Bill Irons** then followed up by completing the task of marking the boards to be replaced. So now we're ready to finish the job of repainting our tables to have them to enjoy for decades to come.

Bill Irons also agreed to be the lead project manager for this picnic table repainting effort. He has identified the following steps in the process:

1. Power wash the remaining tables that need it and remove any rotted boards.
2. Rough sand and/or wire brush any remaining surface areas that require it and replace the boards.
3. Prime.
4. Paint.

Bill will be posting sign-up sheets for these various tasks for different days and times over the next few weeks and I highly encourage you to find a slot that works for you and come down to help in the effort, or if you receive a call to fill one of the crew spots please do your best to work a shift into your schedule. Many hands not only make for light work, but it's a lot more fun too. And while you have your calendar out, be sure to plan on attending the picnic this year on Sunday July 29 and enjoy our improved picnic area and tables. Let's make the 2007 picnic the biggest club turn out of any event this century and set the stage for a real resurgence of group activity here at the club.

I also want to take a moment here to thank **Larry Howard** the club treasurer now for the past year and a half who regrettably had to resign last week for family health reasons. Larry leaves

behind an impressive set of accomplishments from his tenure, including: clean-up of our chart of accounts, transfer of accounting software, improved tracking process for club investments and cash accounts, and well done Profit and Loss statements for every club event and basic function. Larry you will be missed, we appreciate all your efforts and we wish you well.

Gun Notes From Here & There

Bad news. The lawsuit by Russ and Sally Nordyke vs Alameda County's banning gun shows on county property was rejected by a third court. Good news: They will probably appeal. The Nordykes used to do the Marin gun shows until they were banned because of belief in the nonexistent "gun show loophole." (In fact, **every** gun transfer (outside of immediate family) must by law be done through a licensed dealer and subjected to a background check of buyer.)

Hopeful news. Alan Gottlieb, honcho of Second Amendment Foundation and CCRKBA, speaking at San Jose recently, said he had had nearly a half hour chat with Supreme Court Justice Scalia at a meeting overseas, and that Scalia told him that if the Washington DC Parker case reaches the high court, he expects it will be upheld by six, possibly seven votes. Scalia said he had taken Justice Ginsburg shooting, and he thinks even she might support Parker.

More hopeful news. Jeff Knox, Neal's son and currently Exec of Firearms Coalition, believes the possible "next hero of the gun rights movement" may be Speaker Nancy Pelosi. Though far left and anti-gun herself, she will want to keep the Dem. majority in the House and probably won't risk a "gun fight at the DC corral." She knows the Second Amendment did better than the GOP in November's election, losing only a net of two pro-gun votes in Senate, with three of the four Republicans being replaced by solidly pro-gun Democrats.

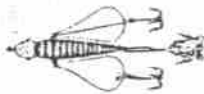
